Dance Individual Project Grant September 1, 2015 General Expert Panel Comments

Comments made by the Expert Panel during its assessment of applications submitted to the September 1, 2015 Dance Individual Project Grant program are outlined below. Please note that these comments provide an overview of common issues noted by the Expert Panel and do not necessarily relate to every unsuccessful application submitted to this deadline. **The Expert Panel does not provide individual comments for each application.**

Expert Panel Comments:

The Expert Panel was impressed by the overall quality of grant submissions. A number of applications may be unsuccessful as a result of a finite program budget relative to the high number of deserving submissions and not necessarily because of reasons listed in comments below.

- 1. The Expert Panel appreciated personal statements articulating why this project is important to the applicant's development and artistic vision. In particular, a clear personal statement from training applicants accompanied by a well-articulated rationale for the choice of study program or workshop was looked upon favourably. This includes an explanation of how a specific training program, relative to similar available training programs, would further develop the applicant towards their stated training needs and career objectives.
- 2. The Expert Panel greatly appreciated DVD support material that allowed for a comprehensive assessment of an applicant's ability. It is helpful for the applicant and Panel that audition or support material demonstrate the applicant's unique individual technical and artistic ability.
- Training applicants should ensure two audition pieces are included as part of the application. The absence or lack of visual support material made it difficult to assess some applications.
- Barre exercises and centre work is only appropriate for very young applicants. Experienced older training applicants should provide appropriate solo audition pieces.
- 5. In a small number of cases the DVD material did not play properly or played horizontally which made it difficult for the Panel to view.
- 6. DVD material should not have audio distractions such as verbal direction or corrections.

- 7. Applicants are strongly encouraged to include letters of reference from teachers or colleagues.
- 8. The Expert Panel had difficulty assessing a small number of applications where the project description was vague or confusing and / or the application lacked support materials such as DVD samples of past work and reviews of past productions.
- Budget The Expert Panel noted that it was important that project budgets:
 - a. Are as accurate and realistic as possible;
 - b. Provide clear accounting break down of all expenses associated with the project;
 - c. Training demonstrate some level of personal contribution or rationale for the absence of personal contribution;
 - d. Not include extraneous expenses such as additional return travel, parent travel, outings, lost wages, loans/mortgages or similar costs not directly associated with core project activity.
- 10. The Panel appreciated projects with appropriate industry standard artist remuneration.
- 11. Budgets with both choreographic and teaching expense line items left the Panel unclear about budget rationale.
- 12. Art creation proposals reliant on large "pending" grants or revenue from multiple sources, the Expert Panel appreciates the inclusion of a "Plan B" outlining how the project may be realized on a smaller scale should not all funding requests be successful.
- 13. Audition tour projects should articulate a clear itinerary that is supported by letters or emails from target companies confirming audition invitation.
- 14. Applicants on the verge of a professional career should demonstrate career goals that align their ability with the reality of the job market.
- 15. Panel members appreciated project descriptions that were clear and concise and resumes that were not longer than four pages.
- 16. Collaborative based projects that rely heavily on the contribution of outside artists should include support material and a stronger description of contributing artist's work and how it will be incorporated into the project.
