- We encourage you to continue to create your art and apply again in the future.
- Please share this Indigenous grant funding opportunity with others.
- Please do not assume that Expert Panel members know who you are or know about your artistic practice, as a lack of information makes it difficult to assess.
- The Expert Panel appreciated recognition of the importance of cultural protocols and where Elders and other knowledge keepers were properly compensated.
- The Expert Panel appreciated projects that demonstrated an opportunity for growth in your artistic career and the development of the discipline or craft.
- When your project involves mentors, please identify your mentors and explain the reason behind the choice, as well as a breakdown of what the mentorship will entail.
- Project descriptions that did not demonstrate genuine engagement with the identified community were challenging for the Expert Panel to assess, particularly when dealing with sensitive issues.

- The Expert Panel appreciated applications that demonstrated respect for traditional knowledge by including information on how it was obtained and their right to share it.
- There was greater support for projects that illuminated the histories, cultures, traditions and contemporary experiences of Indigenous Peoples.
